**Bill Analysis**

SB 292 increases the required frequency of serological testing for syphilis by requiring an attending physician to take a sample of blood from a pregnant woman at the time of the first prenatal visit, between 28 and 32 weeks of gestation, and at the time of delivery. Additionally, the physician must take a blood sample for testing at the occurrence of a miscarriage or stillbirth.
