18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
19	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 85A O.S. 2021, Section 13, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	Section 13. A. 1. A mental injury or illness is not a
22	compensable injury unless caused by a physical injury to the
23	employee, and shall not be considered an injury arising out of and
24	in the course and scope of employment or compensable unless

1 demonstrated by a preponderance of the evidence; provided, however, 2 that this physical injury limitation shall not apply to any victim of a crime of violence or to a law enforcement officer, firefighter, 3 4 or emergency medical technician on a full-time basis by a 5 municipality, county, or the State of Oklahoma, or a volunteer firefighter who suffers post-traumatic stress disorder, as defined 6 7 herein, while responding to an emergency. For the purpose of this 8 section, such employee shall be referred to as a first responder.

9 2. No mental injury or illness under this section shall be 10 compensable unless it is also diagnosed by a licensed psychiatrist 11 or psychologist and unless the diagnosis of the condition meets the 12 criteria established in the most current issue of the Diagnostic and 13 Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders.

14 Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, where a Β. 1. 15 claim is for mental injury or illness, the employee shall be limited 16 to twenty-six (26) weeks of disability benefits unless it is shown 17 by clear and convincing evidence that benefits should continue for a 18 set period of time, not to exceed a total of fifty-two (52) weeks. 19 If the treating physician is of the opinion that the first responder 20 is temporarily unable to perform his or her job or any alternative 21 work offered by the employer, he or she shall be entitled to receive 22 compensation which is the greater of the weekly benefit provided for 23 in a collective bargaining agreement or according to the policy of 24 the employer, or seventy percent (70%) of the injured employee's

1	average weekly wage not to exceed the state average weekly wage. If									
2	the employee has a temporary pension benefit available at no									
3	additional cost to the employee and the benefit is equal to or									
4	greater than the temporary award in this system the employer may

6	disability benefits extend beyond fifty-two (52) weeks.

2	employer shall provide reasonable and necessary medical treatment
3	for such injury, subject to the Oklahoma Workers' Compensation Fee
4	Schedule, for a period of no longer than one (1) year. The employer
5	shall not be responsible for medical treatment in the form of
6	prescription medicine in excess of Ten Thousand Dollars
7	(\$10,000.00).
8	2. During any period in which a first responder is temporarily
9	unable to perform his or her job, the employer shall pay to maintain
10	health insurance coverage for the first responder, if such health
11	insurance was in effect on the date of the injury.
12	D. "Post-traumatic stress disorder", for the purpose of this
13	section, means an injury or condition in which a first responder has
14	been exposed to a traumatic event and:
15	1. Has experienced, witnessed, or was confronted with an event
16	that involved actual or threatened death or serious injury, or a
17	threat to the physical integrity of others, and the response
18	involved fear, helplessness, or horror;
19	2. The traumatic event is persistently re-experienced in one or
20	more of the following ways:
21	a. recurrent and intrusive distressing recollections of
22	the event,
23	b. recurrent distressing dreams,

1	c. acting or feeling as if the traumatic event were									
2	recurring,									
3	d. intense psychological distress at exposure to cues									
4	that symbolize an aspect of the traumatic event, or									
5	e. physiological reactivity on exposure to cues that									
6	symbolize an aspect of the traumatic event;									
7	3. Persistent avoidance of stimuli associated with the trauma									
8	and numbing of general responsiveness such as efforts to avoid									
9	thoughts, feelings or conversations associated with the trauma,									
10	markedly diminished interest or participation in significant									
11	activities, or a feeling of detachment or estrangement from others;									
12	4. Persistent symptoms of increased arousal such as difficulty									
13	falling or staying asleep, irritability or outbursts of anger,									
14	difficulty concentrating, or hypervigilance;									
15	5. The duration of the disturbance is more than one (1) month;									
16	and									
17	6. The disturbance causes clinically significant distress or									
18	impairment in social, occupational and other important areas of									
19	functioning.									
20	E. "Volunteer firefighter", for the purpose of this section,									
21	means a person who is enrolled as a member of a volunteer fire									
22	department with two or less salaried firefighters and who serves in									
23	such capacity without receiving a regular salary.

1	F. "Emergency medical technician", for the purpose of this
2	section, means a person who holds a license as an emergency medical
3	technician, an intermediate or advanced emergency medical
4	technician, or a paramedic, such license issued by the State
5	Department of Health to perform emergency medical services in
6	accordance with the Oklahoma Emergency Response Systems Development
7	Act and the rules and standards promulgated by the State
8	Commissioner of Health.
9	G. Any city or town in this state that incurs a claim relating
10	to post-traumatic stress disorder may, at the city or town's option,
11	transfer the payment of all or any portion of the claim or increased
12	workers' compensation premiums to the judgment rolls of the
13	geographic area or areas serviced by the department of the injured
14	worker and shall be listed on official publications as "First
15	Responder PTSD".
16	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
