An Act relating the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section
1104, as last amended by Section 10, Chapter 47, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp.
2023, Section 1104), which relates to apportionment; restricting certain apportionment limits to certain
fiscal years; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104, as
last amended by Section 10, Chapter 47, 1st Extraordinary Session,
O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 1104), is amended to read
as follows:
Section 1104. A. Unless otherwise provided by law, all fees,
taxes, and penalties collected or received pursuant to the Oklahoma
Vehicle License and Registration Act or Section 1-101 et seq. of

1 this title shall be apportioned and distributed monthly by the Oklahoma Tax Commission in accordance with this section. Service 2 Oklahoma shall provide to the Oklahoma Tax Commission monthly 3 reports of motor vehicle collection information, including, but not 4 5 limited to, motor vehicle monthly apportionment information, refunds, canceled vouchers, waste tire collections, organ donor 6 program amounts, driver license records, prorate amounts, and sales 7 tax amounts. The reports shall be delivered electronically pursuant 8 9 to the current calendar year apportionment disbursement schedule provided to Service Oklahoma by the Oklahoma Tax Commission on or 10 before December 1st annually. 11

12 One percent (1%) of fees collected shall be apportioned to the 13 Licensed Operator Performance Fund created in Section 3-106 of this 14 title, in accordance with the applicable metrics determined by 15 Service Oklahoma.

The following percentages of the monies referred to in 16 в. 1. subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various 17 school districts in accordance with paragraph 2 of this subsection: 18 from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, thirty-five 19 a. and forty-six one-hundredths percent (35.46%), 20 b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 21 30, 2002, thirty-five and ninety-one one-hundredths 22 percent (35.91%), 23

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- c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year ending on June 30, 2015, thirty-six and twenty onehundredths percent (36.20%),
- for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year d. 4 5 ending on June 30, 2019, thirty-six and twenty onehundredths percent (36.20%), but in no event shall the 6 amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 7 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for 8 9 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 10 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 11
- 12 e. for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all subsequent years, thirty-six and twenty one-hundredths 13 percent (36.20%), but in no event shall the amount 14 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 15 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for 16 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts 17 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 18 credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver 19 Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the 20 Oklahoma Statutes. 21

22 2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e
23 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned to the
24 various school districts so that each district shall receive an

amount based upon the proportion that each district's average daily attendance bears to the total average daily attendance of those districts entitled to receive funds pursuant to this section as certified by the State Department of Education.

5 Each district's allocation of funds shall be remitted to the 6 county treasurer of the county wherein the administrative 7 headquarters of the district are located.

8 No district shall be eligible for the funds herein provided 9 unless the district makes an ad valorem tax levy of fifteen (15) 10 mills and maintains nine (9) years of instruction and pursuant to 11 the rules of the State Board of Education, is authorized to maintain 12 ten (10) years of instruction.

C. The following percentages of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury:

17 1. From October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, forty-five and 18 ninety-seven one-hundredths percent (45.97%);

For the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30,
 2002, forty-five and twenty-nine one-hundredths percent (45.29%);
 3. For the year beginning July 1, 2002, and for the subsequent
 fiscal years ending June 30, 2007, forty-four and eighty-four one hundredths percent (44.84%);

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4. For the year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30,
 2008, thirty-nine and eighty-four one-hundredths percent (39.84%);
 5. For the year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30,
 2009, thirty-four and eighty-four one-hundredths percent (34.84%);
 6. For the period beginning July 1, 2009, and ending December
 31, 2012, twenty-nine and eighty-four one-hundredths percent
 (29.84%);

8 7. For the period beginning January 1, 2013, and ending June
9 30, 2013, twenty-nine and thirty-four one-hundredths percent
10 (29.34%);

8. For the year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014, twenty-six and eighty-four one-hundredths percent (26.84%); and

9. For the year beginning July 1, 2014, through the year ending June 30, 2019, twenty-four and eighty-four one-hundredths percent (24.84%).

D. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State
Treasurer to be credited to the State Transportation Fund:

20 1. From October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, thirty one-21 hundredths percent (0.30%);

22 2. For the year beginning July 1, 2001, through the year ending
23 on June 30, 2015, thirty-one one-hundredths percent (0.31%);

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3. For the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year ending on June 30, 2019, thirty-one one-hundredths percent (0.31%), but in no event shall the amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of the General Revenue Fund; and

4. For the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all subsequent 8 9 years, thirty-one one-hundredths percent (0.31%), but in no event 10 shall the amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal year 11 ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such limitation 12 shall be placed to the credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and 13 Driver Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the 14 Oklahoma Statutes. 15

E. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various counties as set forth in paragraph 2 of this subsection:

19 a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, seven and 20 nine one-hundredths percent (7.09%),

b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
30, 2002, seven and eighteen one-hundredths percent
(7.18%),

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- c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year ending on June 30, 2015, seven and twenty-four onehundredths percent (7.24%),
- for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year d. 4 5 ending on June 30, 2019, seven and twenty-four onehundredths percent (7.24%), but in no event shall the 6 amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 7 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for 8 9 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 10 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 11
- for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all 12 e. subsequent years, seven and twenty-four one-hundredths 13 percent (7.24%), but in no event shall the amount 14 apportioned in any fiscal year fiscal years 2019 15 through 2024 pursuant to this subparagraph exceed the 16 total amount apportioned for the fiscal year ending on 17 June 30, 2015, and in no event shall the amount 18 apportioned in fiscal year 2026 and subsequent fiscal 19 years exceed the amount apportioned for the fiscal 20 year ending on June 30, 2025. Any amounts in excess 21 of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of 22 the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund 23
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created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e 3 2. of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned as follows: 4 5 forty percent (40%) of such sum shall be distributed to the various counties in that proportion which the county road mileage of each 6 county bears to the entire state road mileage as certified by the 7 Transportation Commission and the remaining sixty percent (60%) of 8 9 such sum shall be distributed to the various counties on the basis 10 which the population and area of each county bears to the total population and area of the state. The population shall be as shown 11 12 by the last Federal Decennial Census or the most recent annual 13 estimate provided by the United States Bureau of the Census. The funds shall be used for the purpose of constructing and maintaining 14 county highways; provided, however, the county treasurer may deposit 15 so much of the funds in the sinking fund as may be necessary for the 16 17 retirement of interest and annual accrual of indebtedness created by the issuance of county or township bonds for road purposes. 18 Such deposits to the sinking fund shall not exceed forty percent (40%) of 19 the funds allocated to a county pursuant to this paragraph. 20

F. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the county treasurers of the respective counties and by them deposited in a

The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be used for the primary 10 purpose of matching federal funds for the construction of federal 11 12 aid projects on county roads, or constructing and maintaining county 13 or township highways and permanent bridges of such counties. The distribution of monies apportioned by this paragraph shall be made 14 upon the basis of the current formula based upon road mileage, area 15 and population as related to county road improvement and maintenance 16 17 costs. Provided, however, the Department of Transportation may update the formula factors from time to time as necessary to account 18 for changing conditions. 19

G. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
subsection A of this section shall be transmitted by the Tax
Commission to the various counties as set forth in paragraph 2 of
this subsection:

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- a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, three and
 fifty-five one-hundredths percent (3.55%),
 - b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, three and fifty-nine one-hundredths percent (3.59%),
- c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year
 ending on June 30, 2015, three and sixty-two onehundredths percent (3.62%),
- 9 d. for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year ending on June 30, 2019, three and sixty-two one-10 hundredths percent (3.62%), but in no event shall the 11 amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 12 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for 13 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts 14 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 15 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 16 for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all 17 e.
- 18subsequent years, three and sixty-two one-hundredths19percent (3.62%), but in no event shall the amount20apportioned in any fiscal year fiscal years 201921through 2024 pursuant to this subparagraph exceed the22total amount apportioned for the fiscal year ending on23June 30, 2015, and in no event shall the amount24apportioned in fiscal year 2026 and subsequent fiscal

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years exceed the amount apportioned for the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2025. Any amounts in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e 7 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be transmitted to the 8 9 various counties on the basis of a formula to be developed by the Department of Transportation. Such formula shall be similar to that 10 currently used for the distribution of County Bridge Program Funds 11 12 funds, but also taking into consideration the effect of terrain and 13 traffic volume as related to county road improvement and maintenance costs. Provided, however, the Department of Transportation may 14 update the formula factors from time to time as necessary to account 15 for changing conditions. The funds shall be transmitted to the 16 17 various county treasurers to be deposited in the county highway fund of their respective counties. 18

H. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various
counties as set forth in paragraph 2 of this subsection:

- a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, eighty-one
 one-hundredths percent (0.81%),
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- b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002, eighty-two one-hundredths percent (0.82%), c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year ending on June 30, 2015, eighty-three one-hundredths percent (0.83%),
- d. for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year 6 ending on June 30, 2019, eighty-three one-hundredths 7 percent (0.83%), but in no event shall the amount 8 9 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for 10 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts 11 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 12 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 13 for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all e. 14 subsequent years, eighty-three one-hundredths percent 15 (0.83%), but in no event shall the amount apportioned 16 in any fiscal year pursuant to this subparagraph 17 exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal 18 year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess 19 of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of 20 the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund 21 created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 22
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2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e
 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned to the
 various counties based upon the proportion that each county's
 population bears to the total state population.

5 Each county's allocation of funds shall be remitted to the 6 various county treasurers to be deposited in the general fund of the 7 county and used for the support of county government.

8 I. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in 9 subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various 10 cities and incorporated towns as set forth in paragraph 2 of this 11 subsection:

- a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, three and
 four one-hundredths percent (3.04%),
- b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
 30, 2002, three and eight one-hundredths percent
 (3.08%),
- 17 c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year 18 ending on June 30, 2015, three and ten one-hundredths 19 percent (3.10%),
- d. for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year
 ending on June 30, 2019, three and ten one-hundredths
 percent (3.10%), but in no event shall the amount
 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this
 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for

1 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the 2 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and 3 for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all 4 e. 5 subsequent years, three and ten one-hundredths percent (3.10%), but in no event shall the amount apportioned 6 in any fiscal year pursuant to this subparagraph 7 exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal 8 9 year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of 10 the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund 11 created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 12 Statutes. 13

The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e 2. 14 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned to the 15 various cities and incorporated towns based upon the proportion that 16 17 each city or incorporated town's population bears to the total population of all cities and incorporated towns in the state. 18 Such funds shall be remitted to the various county treasurers for 19 allocation to the various cities and incorporated towns. All such 20 funds shall be used for the construction, maintenance, repair, 21 improvement and lighting of streets and alleys. Provided, however, 22 the governing board of any city or town may, with the approval of 23 the county excise board, transfer any surplus funds to the general 24

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revenue fund of such city or town whenever an emergency requires
 such a transfer.

J. The following percentages of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement Fund:

7 1. From October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, one and twenty-8 two one-hundredths percent (1.22%);

9 2. For the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30,
10 2002, one and twenty-three one-hundredths percent (1.23%); and
11 3. For the year beginning July 1, 2002, and all subsequent
12 years, one and twenty-four one-hundredths percent (1.24%).

K. Three one-hundredths of one percent (3/100 of 1%) of the monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the Wildlife Conservation Fund. Seventy-five percent (75%) of the funds shall be used for fish habitat restoration and twenty-five percent (25%) of the funds shall be used in the fish hatchery system for fish production.

L. 1. For the year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30,
2008, five percent (5%) of monies referred to in subsection A of
this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited
to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as created in
Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

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2. For the year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30,
 2009, ten percent (10%) of monies referred to in subsection A of
 this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited
 to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as created in
 Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

6 3. For the period beginning July 1, 2009, and ending December 7 31, 2012, fifteen percent (15%) of monies referred to in subsection 8 A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be 9 credited to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as 10 created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

4. For the period beginning January 1, 2013, and ending June
30, 2013, fifteen and fifty one-hundredths percent (15.50%) of
monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted
to the State Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for
Roads and Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the
Oklahoma Statutes.

5. For the year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014, eighteen percent (18%) of monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

6. For the year beginning July 1, 2014, twenty percent (20%) of monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for

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Roads and Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the
 Oklahoma Statutes.

7. For the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year ending 3 on June 30, 2019, twenty percent (20%) of monies referred to in 4 5 subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for Roads and 6 Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 7 Statutes, but in no event shall the total amount apportioned in any 8 9 fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00). Any amounts in excess of One 10 Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) shall be placed to 11 the credit of the General Revenue Fund. 12

13 8. Except as provided in subparagraph b of this a. paragraph, for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and 14 all subsequent years, twenty percent (20%) of monies 15 referred to in subsection A of this section shall be 16 remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the 17 County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as 18 created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma 19 Statutes, but in no event shall the total amount 20 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this 21 paragraph exceed the fiscal year limitations provided 22 in subparagraph c of this paragraph. Any amounts in 23 excess of the fiscal year limitations provided in 24

subparagraph c of this paragraph shall be placed to the credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma Statutes,

- 5 b. (1)for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, the 6 Oklahoma Tax Commission shall remit twenty-five 7 percent (25%) of the monthly allocation, 8 9 otherwise scheduled to be credited to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund, to the 10 various counties of the state. The Commission 11 12 shall distribute such funds monthly to each 13 county treasurer as follows:
 - (a) one-third (1/3) of such funds shall be distributed to the various counties in the proportion which the area of each county bears to the total area of the state,
 - (b) one-third (1/3) of such funds shall be distributed to the various counties in the proportion which the certified county road miles of each county bear to the total sum of county road miles in the state, and
 - (c) one-third (1/3) of such funds shall be distributed to the various counties in the

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1 proportion which the total replacement cost 2 for obsolete or deficient bridges according 3 to the most recent ODOT Department of Transportation yearly Bridge Summary Report 4 5 for County Bridges for each county bears to the total amount of such cost for all such 6 county bridges in the state, and 7 (2)for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, and 8 9 all subsequent fiscal years thereafter, the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall remit twenty-five 10 percent (25%) of the monthly allocation, 11 otherwise scheduled to be credited to the County 12 13 Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund, to the various counties of the state. The Commission 14 shall distribute such funds monthly to each 15 county treasurer as follows: 16

- 17 (a) one-third (1/3) of such funds shall be
 18 distributed to the various counties in the
 19 proportion which the area of each county
 20 bears to the total area of the state,
 - (b) one-third (1/3) of such funds shall be distributed to the various counties in the proportion which the certified county road

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1	miles of each county bear to the total sum
2	of county road miles in the state, and
3	(c) one-third $(1/3)$ of such funds shall be
4	distributed to the various counties in the
5	proportion which the number of county
6	bridges in each county according to the ODOT
7	Department of Transportation 2020 Bridge
8	Summary Report for County Bridges bears to
9	the total sum of county bridges in the state
10	according to such report.
11	Each county treasurer shall deposit such funds to the
12	county's county highway fund and such funds shall be used
13	for maintenance and operations. In no event shall the
14	total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to the
