PROPOSAL: New Law and Amendatory

SB 1499 creates the Feminine Hygiene Program to be administered by the State Department of Health and modifies the apportionment of sales tax revenues by allocating \$1 million to the newly created Feminine Hygiene Program Revolving Fund in FY 25 and for subsequent years. This measure also proposes to amend 68 O.S. § 1356 by exempting from the sales tax levy, sales of feminine hygiene products¹ to certain organizations which are exempt from taxation pursuant to 26 U.S.C., § 501(c)(3).

EFFECTIVE DATE: November 1, 2024

REVENUE IMPACT:

FY 25: Apportionment of \$1 million to the Feminine Hygiene Program Revolving Fund and a like decrease to other funds, including the General Revenue Fund. Unknown decrease in state sales tax collections.

FY 26: Apportionment of \$1 million to the Feminine Hygiene Program Revolving Fund and a like decrease to other funds, including the General Revenue Fund. Unknown decrease in state sales tax collections.
