PROPOSAL: <u>New Law</u>

SB 1823 proposes to create the Basic Government Transparency Act, which requires OMES to establish and maintain a public website that lists all governmental entities with jurisdiction over an address entered by use of the website. In addition, each governmental entity must maintain a public website and online register that presents certain financial information, including details for financial transactions in excess of \$15,000.<sup>1</sup> Failure to comply with the proposal may result in penalties pursuant to 51 O.S. § 24.1.

EFFECTIVE DATE: November 1, 2024

## **REVENUE IMPACT:** None.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPACT:**

A minimal administrative cost is expected for the Oklahoma Tax Commission (OTC) to develop and maintain a webpage on the OTC's current website with financial information in the format required by the proposal.
