**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 712 will require hospitals to provide opioid antagonists to those persons showing symptoms of opioid overdose or abuse to upon discharge from an emergency department. If the individual has private insurance, the hospital may bill the plan; if the individual is on Medicaid, the hospital may bill OHCA for payment. All other persons receiving opioid antagonists will do so at no cost and be provided by DMHSAS. DMHSAS is currently receiving federal grant funding that is targeted for opioid antagonist distribution. Those funds will be used to fund the provisions of this measure.
