Research Analysis

The PCS for HB 1195 creates the Secure Telecommunications Act, which:

- Defines *critical telecommunications infrastructure, federally banned corporation, foreign adversary, and telecommunications provider*;
- Prohibits components manufactured by a federally banned corporation or foreign adversary from being part of the state’s critical telecommunications infrastructure;
- Requires the replacement of components manufactured by a federally banned corporation or foreign adversary that are already part of the state's critical telecommunications infrastructure; and
- Creates a process for telecommunications providers to register with the Oklahoma Corporation Commission.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1195 in its current form creates the Secure Telecommunications Act of 2024 and provides certain regulatory responsibilities on the Corporation Commission. The measure also creates a registration fee designed to defray costs of the Corporation Commission related to administration of the Act; for this reason the measure is anticipated to be budget neutral to the agency and the state budget.
