**Research Analysis**

SB 1702 outlines the confidentiality requirement and discovery exemptions related to the death penalty execution process. The measure provides that the confidentiality requirement and discovery exemption is to be broadly construed and includes documents, records, photographs, or other information that may identify or reasonably lead to the identification of any person or entity who participates in the execution process or any entity who supplies the drugs, medical supplies or medical equipment for the execution.
