15	Section 1-515. A. Every physician attending a pregnant woman
16	in Oklahoma during gestation shall, in the case of each woman so
17	attended, take or cause to be taken a sample of blood of such woman
18	at the time of first examination each of the following occurrences,
19	and shall submit such sample to an approved laboratory for a
20	standard serological test for syphilis:
21	1. At the time of the first prenatal visit;
22	2. Between twenty-eight (28) and thirty-two (32) weeks'
23	gestation; and
24	3. At the time of delivery.

- B. In addition to the occurrences listed in subsection A of this section, the attending physician of a woman presenting with a spontaneous miscarriage or stillbirth shall take or cause to be taken a sample of blood of such woman and shall submit such sample to an approved laboratory for a standard serological test for syphilis.
- C. Every other person permitted by law to attend upon pregnant women in the state but not permitted by law to take blood tests shall cause a sample of the blood of such pregnant woman to be taken by a duly licensed physician, licensed to practice in the State of Oklahoma this state, and submitted to an approved laboratory for a standard serological test for syphilis.
- <u>D.</u> The term "approved laboratory" shall mean a laboratory approved for the purposes of this section by the State Commissioner of Health. A standard serological test for syphilis shall be one recognized as such by the Commissioner. Such laboratory tests shall be made, on request, without charge by the State Department of Health.
  - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
