7 An Act relating to driver licenses; amending 21 O.S.
8 2021, Section 1550.42, which relates to entities
9 authorized to print identification documents;
10 clarifying language; removing certain limitation;
11 removing certain exceptions; removing certain license
12 renewal requirement; removing certain presumption;
13 removing certain application; removing certain
14 exemption; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-109.3, as
15 amended by Section 15, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (26
16 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 4-109.3), which relates to
17 motor vehicle licensing agencies and voter
18 registration; prohibiting voter registration services
19 from being provided to certain applicants and
20 licensees; requiring Service Oklahoma to transmit
21 certain identifying information to the Secretary of
22 the State Election Board; requiring certain action
23 and notice; prohibiting retention of certain
24 information; providing certain exception; amending 47
O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as last amended by Section
37, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022,
Section 6-101), which relates to class requirements
for driver licenses and fees; creating certain fee;
updating statutory reference; amending 47 O.S. 2021,
Section 6-103, as amended by Section 40, Chapter 282,
O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-103),
which relates to persons not to be licensed; updating
statutory references; modifying preclusion; requiring
certain documents be presented to allow for the
issuance of driver licenses to aliens; amending 47
O.S. 2021, Section 6-106, as amended by Section 45,
Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section
6-106), which relates to application for license;
providing an acceptable form of proof of identity;
allowing for certain information to be provided by an
applicant; updating statutory reference; providing

1 certain preclusions; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section
2 6-114, as amended by Section 54, Chapter 282, O.S.L.
3 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-114), which
4 relates to replacement driver licenses; removing
5 certain requirements and replacement period
6 limitations for aliens; amending 47 O.S. 2021,
7 Section 6-115, as amended by Section 55, Chapter 282,
8 O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-115),
9 which relates to issuance, expiration, and renewal of
10 driver licenses; modifying certain limitations for
11 certain applicants or licensees; requiring certain
12 applicants provide additional specific documentation;
13 amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-122, as amended by
14 Section 62, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
15 2022, Section 6-122), which relates to renewal by
16 mail; modifying certain exceptions; requiring Service
17 Oklahoma to provide certain notation of status;
18 prohibiting voter registration services from being
19 provided to certain applicants and licensees;
20 updating statutory language; providing for
21 codification; and providing an effective date.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1550.42, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1550.42. ~~A.~~ The following entities may create, publish or otherwise manufacture an identification document, identification card, or identification certificate and may possess an engraved plate or other such device for the printing of such identification; provided, the name of the issuing entity shall be clearly printed upon the face of the identification:

1. Businesses, companies, corporations, service organizations and federal, state and local governmental agencies for employee

1 identification which is designed to identify the bearer as an
2 employee;

3 2. Businesses, companies, corporations and service
4 organizations for customer identification which is designed to
5 identify the bearer as a customer or member;

6 3. Federal, state and local government agencies for purposes
7 authorized or required by law or any legitimate purpose consistent
8 with the duties of such an agency, including, but not limited to,
9 voter identification cards, driver licenses, nondriver
10 identification cards, passports, birth certificates and social
11 security cards;

12 4. Any public school or state or private educational
13 institution, as defined by Sections 1-106, 21-101 or 3102 of Title
14 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, to identify the bearer as an
15 administrator, faculty member, student or employee;

16 5. Any professional organization or labor union to identify the
17 bearer as a member of the professional organization or labor union;
18 and

19 6. Businesses, companies or corporations which manufacture
20 medical-alert identification for the wearer thereof.

21 ~~B. All identification documents as provided for in paragraph 3~~
22 ~~or 4 of subsection A of this section shall be issued only to United~~
23 ~~States citizens, nationals and legal permanent resident aliens.~~

1 ~~C. The provisions of subsection B of this section shall not~~
2 ~~apply when an applicant presents, in person, valid documentary~~
3 ~~evidence of:~~

4 ~~1. A valid, unexpired immigrant or nonimmigrant visa status for~~
5 ~~admission into the United States;~~

6 ~~2. A pending or approved application for asylum in the United~~
7 ~~States;~~

8 ~~3. Admission into the United States in refugee status;~~

9 ~~4. A pending or approved application for temporary protected~~
10 ~~status in the United States;~~

11 ~~5. Approved deferred action status; or~~

12 ~~6. A pending application for adjustment of status to legal~~
13 ~~permanent residence status or conditional resident status.~~

14 ~~Upon approval, the applicant may be issued an identification~~
15 ~~document provided for in paragraph 3 or 4 of subsection A of this~~
16 ~~section. Such identification document shall be valid only during~~
17 ~~the period of time of the authorized stay of the applicant in the~~
18 ~~United States or, if there is no definite end to the period of~~
19 ~~authorized stay, a period of one (1) year. Any identification~~
20 ~~document issued pursuant to the provisions of this subsection shall~~
21 ~~clearly indicate that it is temporary and shall state the date that~~
22 ~~the identification document expires. Such identification document~~
23 ~~may be renewed only upon presentation of valid documentary evidence~~
24 ~~that the status by which the applicant qualified for the~~

1 ~~identification document has been extended by the United States~~
2 ~~Citizenship and Immigration Services or other authorized agency of~~
3 ~~the United States Department of Homeland Security.~~

4 ~~D. The provisions of subsection B of this section shall not~~
5 ~~apply to an identification document described in paragraph 4 of~~
6 ~~subsection A of this section that is only valid for use on the~~
7 ~~campus or facility of that educational institution and includes a~~
8 ~~statement of such restricted validity clearly and conspicuously~~
9 ~~printed upon the face of the identification document.~~

10 ~~E. Any driver license issued to a person who is not a United~~
11 ~~States citizen, national or legal permanent resident alien for which~~
12 ~~an application has been made for renewal, duplication or reissuance~~
13 ~~shall be presumed to have been issued in accordance with the~~
14 ~~provisions of subsection C of this section; provided that, at the~~
15 ~~time the application is made, the driver license has not expired, or~~
16 ~~been cancelled, suspended or revoked. The requirements of~~
17 ~~subsection C of this section shall apply, however, to a renewal,~~
18 ~~duplication or reissuance if the Department of Public Safety is~~
19 ~~notified by a local, state or federal government agency of~~
20 ~~information in the possession of the agency indicating a reasonable~~
21 ~~suspicion that the individual seeking such renewal, duplication or~~
22 ~~reissuance is present in the United States in violation of law. The~~
23 ~~provisions of this subsection shall not apply to United States~~
24 ~~citizens, nationals or legal permanent resident aliens.~~

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-109.3, as
2 amended by Section 15, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (26 O.S. Supp. 2022,
3 Section 4-109.3), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 4-109.3. A. When a qualified elector applies for
5 issuance or renewal of an Oklahoma driver license, or issuance of a
6 state identification card issued pursuant to Section 6-105 of Title
7 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes, he or she shall be provided voter
8 registration services as required by the National Voter Registration
9 Act. Any applicant or licensee providing an individual tax
10 identification number to Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator
11 pursuant to Section 6-106 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes shall
12 not be provided voter registration services. All completed paper
13 voter registration applications shall be transmitted by the agency
14 accepting the application at the close of business each week to the
15 State Election Board in preaddressed, postage prepaid envelopes
16 provided by the State Election Board. If a person registers or
17 declines to register to vote, the office at which the person submits
18 the voter registration application or the fact that the person
19 declined to register shall remain confidential and will be used only
20 for voter registration purposes.

21 B. A change of address for an Oklahoma driver license or state
22 identification card submitted by a registered voter shall also serve
23 as a change of address for voter registration purposes if the new
24 address is within the same county where the voter is registered to

1 vote. If the new address is outside the county where the voter is
2 currently registered to vote, the voter shall be sent a notice and
3 application with instructions for registering to vote at the new
4 address. A change of address for an Oklahoma driver license or
5 state identification card shall not be used to update a voter
6 registration address if the registrant states in writing that the
7 change of address is not for voter registration purposes.

8 C. Licensed operators shall receive fifty cents (\$0.50) per
9 valid paper voter registration application or application for change
10 in voter registration taken by themselves and employees of the
11 licensed operator's office taken at the licensed operator's office,
12 payable by the State Election Board.

13 D. Service Oklahoma shall notify the Secretary of the State
14 Election Board of licensed operator appointments. Service Oklahoma
15 shall notify the Secretary of the State Election Board of licensed
16 operators qualified to issue driver licenses.

17 E. The Secretary of the State Election Board is authorized to
18 develop with Service Oklahoma a system to electronically transmit
19 voter registration applications from licensed operators to the State
20 Election Board or county election boards. Such system shall be
21 consistent with the requirements for electronic submission of voter
22 registration applications provided in Section 4-109.4 of this title.

23 F. 1. At least quarterly, Service Oklahoma shall transmit to
24 the Secretary of the State Election Board identifying information

1 that shall include the name, date of birth, residential address, and
2 mailing address of all applicants or licensees who have provided an
3 individual tax identification number pursuant to Section 6-106 of
4 Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

5 2. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall compare the
6 transmitted identifying information provided pursuant to paragraph 1
7 of this subsection with the list of registered voters in each
8 county. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall notify the
9 secretary of any relevant county election board of any matches based
10 on the identifying information provided by Service Oklahoma.

11 3. Upon receipt of notification from the Secretary of the State
12 Election Board pursuant to paragraph 2 of this subsection, the
13 secretary of the county election board shall notify the proper
14 authority pursuant to Section 16-123 of this title, to investigate
15 whether a violation related to voting crimes or voter registration
16 has occurred.

17 4. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall not retain
18 the information provided pursuant to paragraph 1 of this subsection
19 after the completion of his or her duties pursuant to paragraph 2 of
20 this subsection except as may be necessary when assisting with an
21 investigation.

22 G. The Secretary of the State Election Board shall promulgate
23 rules and procedures to implement the requirements of this section.
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1 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as
2 last amended by Section 37, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
3 2022, Section 6-101), is amended to read as follows:

4 Section 6-101. A. No person, except those hereinafter
5 expressly exempted in Sections 6-102 and 6-102.1 of this title,
6 shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless
7 the person has a valid Oklahoma driver license for the class of
8 vehicle being operated under the provisions of this title. No
9 person shall be permitted to possess more than one valid license at
10 any time, except as provided in paragraph 4 of subsection F of this
11 section.

12 B. 1. No person shall operate a Class A commercial motor
13 vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and
14 holds a valid Class A commercial license, except as provided in
15 paragraph 5 of this subsection and subsection F of this section.
16 Any person holding a valid Class A commercial license shall be
17 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes A, B, C and D, except
18 as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

19 2. No person shall operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle
20 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
21 valid Class B commercial license, except as provided in paragraph 5
22 of subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class B
23 commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in
24

1 Classes B, C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this
2 subsection.

3 3. No person shall operate a Class C commercial motor vehicle
4 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
5 valid Class C commercial license, except as provided in subsection F
6 of this section. Any person holding a valid Class C commercial
7 license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes C
8 and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

9 4. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be
10 licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be
11 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172,
12 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section;
13 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be
14 licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded
15 for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F,
16 except as provided in subsection F of this section.

17 5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who
18 successfully completes all examinations required by law may be
19 issued by Service Oklahoma:

- 20 a. a restricted Class A commercial license which shall
21 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
22 A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest
23 purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or

1 b. a restricted Class B commercial license which shall
2 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
3 B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a
4 Class D motor vehicle.

5 6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the
6 person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class
7 D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this
8 title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be
9 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

10 C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section
11 may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and
12 highways in this state.

13 D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle
14 without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle
15 endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant
16 for an original driver license shall be required to successfully
17 complete a written examination, vision examination and driving
18 examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of
19 Public Safety, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified
20 state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the
21 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the applicant
22 is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a
23 motorcycle endorsement thereon. The written examination and driving
24 examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service Oklahoma

1 upon verification that the person has successfully completed a
2 certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the
3 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

4 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully
5 possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for
6 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written
7 examination, vision examination and driving examination for a
8 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, in conjunction with
9 Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic
10 rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service
11 Oklahoma, if the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to
12 be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination
13 and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service
14 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully
15 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course
16 approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

17 F. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply
18 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. Service
19 Oklahoma, after the applicant has passed all parts of the
20 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all
21 parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license
22 other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a
23 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having
24 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a

1 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant
2 to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C
3 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the
4 purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules
5 promulgated by the Department.

6 2. This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period
7 as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one hundred eighty
8 (180) days, which may be renewed one time for an additional one
9 hundred eighty (180) days; provided, such commercial learner permit
10 may be suspended, revoked, canceled, denied or disqualified at the
11 discretion of the Department, with notice to Service Oklahoma, for
12 violation of the restrictions, for failing to give the required or
13 correct information on the application or for violation of any
14 traffic laws of this state pertaining to the operation of a motor
15 vehicle. Except as otherwise provided, the lawful possessor of a
16 commercial learner permit who has been issued a commercial learner
17 permit for a minimum of fourteen (14) days may have the restriction
18 requiring an accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily
19 completing a driver's examination; provided, the removal of a
20 restriction shall not authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C
21 commercial motor vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited
22 by law.

23 3. No person shall apply for and Service Oklahoma shall not
24 issue an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person

1 has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for
2 at least fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class
3 B or C license and who wishes to apply for another class of
4 commercial driver license shall be required to apply for a
5 commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at least
6 fourteen (14) days before applying for the Class A or B license, as
7 applicable. Any person who currently holds a Class A, B or C
8 license and who wishes to add an endorsement or remove a restriction
9 for which a skills examination is required shall be required to
10 apply for a commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at
11 least fourteen (14) days before applying for the endorsement.

12 4. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by Service
13 Oklahoma as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only
14 in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional
15 driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of
16 which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they have
17 been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial motor
18 vehicle as provided in this subsection.

19 5. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as
20 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit
21 shall not be renewed again. Any person who has held a commercial
22 learner permit for the initial issuance period and one renewal
23 period shall not be eligible for and Service Oklahoma shall not
24 issue another renewal of the permit; provided, the person may

1 reapply for a new commercial learner permit, as provided for in this
2 subsection.

3 G. 1. For purposes of this title:

4 a. "REAL ID Compliant Driver License" or "Identification
5 Card" means a driver license or identification card
6 issued by the State of Oklahoma that has been
7 certified by the United States Department of Homeland
8 Security (USDHS) as compliant with the requirements of
9 the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law No. 109-13. A
10 REAL ID Compliant Driver License or Identification
11 Card and the process through which it is issued
12 incorporate a variety of security measures designed to
13 protect the integrity and trustworthiness of the
14 license or card. A REAL ID Compliant Driver License
15 or Identification Card will be clearly marked on the
16 face indicating that it is a compliant document, and

17 b. "REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License" or
18 "Identification Card" means a driver license or
19 identification card issued by the State of Oklahoma
20 that has not been certified by the United States
21 Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) as being
22 compliant with the requirements of the REAL ID Act. A
23 REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification
24 Card will be clearly marked on the face indicating

1 that it is not compliant with the federal REAL ID Act
2 and is not acceptable for official federal purposes.
3 The driver license or identification card will have a
4 unique design or color indicator that clearly
5 distinguishes it from a compliant license or card.

6 2. Original Driver License and Identification Card Issuance:

- 7 a. Application for an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
8 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
9 shall be made to Service Oklahoma.
- 10 b. Service Oklahoma employees shall perform all document
11 recognition and other requirements needed for approval
12 of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
13 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
14 application.
- 15 c. Upon approval of an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
16 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
17 application, the applicant may take the approved
18 application document to a licensed operator to receive
19 a temporary driver license or identification card.
- 20 d. The licensed operator shall process the approved REAL
21 ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
22 Identification Card application and upon payment shall
23 provide the applicant a temporary driver license or
24 identification card. A temporary driver license or

1 identification card shall afford the holder the
2 privileges otherwise granted by the specific class of
3 driver license or identification card for the period
4 of time listed on the temporary driver license or
5 identification card or the period of time prior to the
6 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
7 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card,
8 whichever time period is shorter.

9 3. REAL ID Compliant Driver License and Identification Card

10 Renewal and Replacement:

- 11 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
12 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card may be
13 made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator;
14 provided, such licensed operator is authorized to
15 process application for REAL ID Compliant Driver
16 Licenses and Identification Cards. A licensed
17 operator may process the voluntary downgrade of a REAL
18 ID Compliant Commercial Driver License to any lower
19 class license upon request of the licensee; provided,
20 no additional endorsements or restrictions are placed
21 on the license.
- 22 b. Service Oklahoma employees or authorized licensed
23 operators shall perform all document recognition and
24 other requirements needed for approval of a renewal or

1 replacement REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
2 Identification Card application.

3 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
4 Compliant Driver License or Identification Card
5 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
6 driver license or identification card from Service
7 Oklahoma or an authorized licensed operator.

8 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
9 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
10 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
11 the specific class of driver license or identification
12 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time
13 listed on the temporary driver license or
14 identification card or the period of time prior to the
15 applicant receiving a REAL ID Compliant Driver License
16 or Identification Card, whichever time period is
17 shorter.

18 e. For purposes of this title, an application for a REAL
19 ID Compliant Driver License or Identification Card by
20 an individual with a valid Oklahoma-issued driver
21 license or identification card shall be considered a
22 renewal of a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
23 Identification Card.

1 4. REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License and Identification Card

2 Renewal and Replacement:

- 3 a. Application for renewal or replacement of a REAL ID
4 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card may
5 be made to Service Oklahoma or to a licensed operator.
6 A licensed operator may process the voluntary
7 downgrade of a REAL ID Noncompliant Commercial Driver
8 License to any lower class license upon request of the
9 licensee; provided, no additional endorsements or
10 restrictions are added to the license.
- 11 b. Service Oklahoma employees or licensed operators shall
12 perform all document recognition and other
13 requirements needed for approval of a renewal or
14 replacement REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
15 Identification Card application.
- 16 c. Upon approval of a renewal or replacement REAL ID
17 Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
18 application, the applicant may receive a temporary
19 driver license or identification card from Service
20 Oklahoma or a licensed operator.
- 21 d. A temporary driver license or identification card
22 acquired under the provisions of this paragraph shall
23 afford the holder the privileges otherwise granted by
24 the specific class of driver license or identification
25

1 card being renewed or replaced for the period of time
2 listed on the temporary driver license or
3 identification card or the period of time prior to the
4 applicant receiving a REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
5 License or Identification Card, whichever time period
6 is shorter.

7 H. 1. The fee charged for an approved application for an
8 original Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Noncompliant Driver
9 License or an approved application for the addition of an
10 endorsement to a current valid Oklahoma REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID
11 Noncompliant Driver License shall be assessed in accordance with the
12 following schedule:

10 B. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the expiration
11 date of an initial license shall be no more than either four (4)
12 years or eight (8) years from the last day of the month of issuance
13 or no more than either four (4) years or eight (8) years from the
14 last day of the birth month of the applicant immediately preceding
15 the date of issuance, if requested by the applicant.

16 C. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the expiration
17 date of a renewal license shall be:

18 1. For a renewal during the month of expiration, either four
19 (4) years or eight (8) years from the last day of the month of
20 expiration of the expiring license or either four (4) or eight (8)
21 years from the last day of the birth month of the licensee
22 immediately preceding the expiration date of the expiring license,
23 if requested by the licensee; or

1 2. For a renewal prior to the month of expiration, as provided
2 by rule of Service Oklahoma, either four (4) or eight (8) years from
3 the last day of the month of expiration of the current license;
4 provided, no license shall be issued with an expiration date of more
5 than five (5) years from the date of renewal on a four (4) year
6 license or nine (9) years from the date of renewal on an eight (8)
7 year license.

8 D. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection E of Section
9 1550.42 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes, any Oklahoma driver
10 license that is not more than one (1) year past the date of
11 expiration provided on the driver license shall be presumed to be a
12 valid form of identification for the purposes of renewing an
13 Oklahoma driver license.

14 E. Except as otherwise provided in this section, every driver
15 license shall be renewable by the licensee upon application to
16 either Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator, furnishing the
17 current mailing address of the person and payment of the required
18 fee, if the person is otherwise eligible for renewal. If the
19 licensee is an alien applicant that was previously issued a driver
20 license after having provided proof of filing a state tax return
21 pursuant to subsection A of Section 6-103 of this title and an
22 individual tax identification number pursuant to subsection B of
23 Section 6-106 of this title, then the licensee shall appear before a
24 driver license examiner of Service Oklahoma ~~and shall be issued a~~

1 ~~renewal driver license for a period which does not exceed the lesser~~

8 proof of having filed a state tax return for each year between the
9 date of issuance of the license and for the year prior to the
10 expiration of the license.

11 F. All applicants for renewals of driver licenses who have
12 proven collision records or apparent physical defects may be
13 required to take an examination as specified by Service Oklahoma.

14 G. When a person makes application for a driver license, or
15 makes application to renew a driver license, and the person has been
16 convicted of, or received a deferred judgment for, any offense
17 required to register pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act,
18 the driver license shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from
19 the month of issuance, but may be renewed yearly during the time the
20 person is registered on the Sex Offender Registry. Notwithstanding
21 any other provision of law, the cost for such license shall be the
22 same as for other driver licenses and renewals.

1 H. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules prescribing forms of
2 identification acceptable for the renewal of an Oklahoma driver
3 license.

4 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-122, as
5 amended by Section 62, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022,
6 Section 6-122), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 6-122. Service Oklahoma may develop procedures whereby
8 driver licenses issued under the provisions of Section 6-101 et seq.
9 of this title may be renewed or replaced by the applicant by mail or
10 online except for licenses to be renewed ~~or replaced by aliens~~ by
11 applicants having previously provided proof of having filed a state
12 tax return and an individual tax identification number as prescribed
13 by subsection E of Section 6-115 of this title. Any license issued
14 pursuant to this section shall be valid for a period as prescribed
15 in Section 6-115 of this title. Service Oklahoma shall not renew or
16 replace a license by mail or online unless the immediately preceding
17 issuance, renewal or replacement was done in person by the
18 applicant.

19 Provided, any person or the spouse or dependent of a person:

20 1. Who is on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United
21 States; or

22 2. Who is currently employed as a civilian contractor with the
23 Armed Forces of the United States,

1 living outside of Oklahoma and having a valid Class D driver license
2 issued by ~~the State of Oklahoma~~ this state, requiring no material
3 change, may apply for no more than three consecutive renewals or
4 replacement of such license by mail or online, in accordance with
5 Service Oklahoma rules. A fourth consecutive renewal or replacement
6 must be done in person.

7 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
8 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-125 of Title 47, unless there
9 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

10 A. Service Oklahoma shall make space available in the upper
11 left-hand corner of the front of a driver license issued to an
12 applicant that provided an individual tax identification number, for
13 the letters "N.R.", which shall be designed by Service Oklahoma and
14 shall serve as a notation of status as a non-resident of the United
15 States.

16 B. An applicant or licensee who provides an individual tax
17 identification number to Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator
18 shall be prohibited from receiving voter registration services as
19 described in subsection A of Section 4-109.3 of Title 26 of the
20 Oklahoma Statutes.

21 SECTION 10. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.

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
