16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 107.5 of Title 43, unless there
18	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. Except as provided in paragraph 1 of this subsection, a
20	court may order additional periods of possession of or access to a
21	child to compensate for the denial of court-ordered possession or
22	access.
23	1. Unless a party shows good cause why the order should not be

rendered, a court shall order additional periods of possession of or

access to a child to compensate for a denial of court-ordered
possession or access that resulted from an investigation by the
Department of Human Services that did not result in a finding of
abuse or neglect.

- 2. The additional periods of possession or access:
 - a. shall be of the same type and duration of the possession or access that was denied,
 - may include weekend, holiday, and summer possession or access, and
 - c. shall occur on or before the second anniversary of the date the court finds that court-ordered possession or access has been denied.
- B. The person denied possession or access is entitled to decide the time of the additional possession or access, subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 of subsection A of this section.
 - C. Paragraph 1 of subsection A of this section shall not:
- 1. Create a cause of action against the Department of Human Services; or
 - 2. Waive sovereign immunity to suit or liability.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
