**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1764 amends current law to include county-owned and municipal-owned lands for purposes of prohibiting unauthorized camps. The Oklahoma Department of Public Safety does not collect any portion of municipal fines or fees.

The Policy Amendment to HB 1764 permits a county or municipality to opt out with a majority vote by its governing body. The amendment does not alter the fiscal impact of the measure. Therefore, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
