Bill Analysis

SB 483 authorizes the board of county commissioners to establish a relocation assistance program. No individual who is on parole or probation, is unable to travel alone due to disability or because he or she poses a direct risk to himself or herself or others, is not sober at the time when the individual will begin to travel or is unable to abstain from drinking alcohol or using illicit substances while traveling, or has participated in a relocation assistance program within this state within the previous 2 years may participate in the program. Individuals on parole or probation may participate if his or her parole agent or probation officer authorizes the move to another jurisdiction. Individuals must be homeless to participate in the program. County employees must make direct contact with the family member, employer, or other person willing to receive the homeless individual prior to providing transportation. A county that conducts a relocation assistance program shall not be liable for any claims of injuries or damages.
