**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 158 creates the Oklahoma Emergency Weather Response and Tracking Regulatory Act, authorizes Service Oklahoma to create a professional severe weather tracker license, requires any professional severe weather tracker employed by a qualified media outlet to have said license, establishes a fee structure for said license, and creates the Severe Weather Tracker Licensure Fund. Service Oklahoma anticipates a projected first year revenue of between \$75,000 and \$150,000 with a one-time \$50,000 expenditure to implement and maintain the professional severe weather tracker licensing program. Assuming an 80% retention rate and an annual increase of 10% in new applications, subsequent annual revenues would range from \$37,500-\$75,000.
