**Bill Summary and  
Fiscal Analysis:**

SB 464 would require any passenger in a vehicle who is under the age of 18 to be secured by a safety seat belt. A violation of this provision shall be punishable by a fine of \$20 and court costs. This would expand on the existing requirement that a driver provide the protection of a child passenger restraint system to any child under 8 years of age or be punished by a fine of \$50 and pay all court costs. The Department of Public Safety does not anticipate any negative fiscal impact, and any additional revenues collected would be dependent on the number of convictions. The Department has stated collections were \$89,270 for FY'24.
