## 1 STATE OF OKLAHOMA 2 1st Session of the 60th Legislature (2025) POLICY COMMITTEE 3 RECOMMENDATION 4 FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1817 By: Worthen 5 6 7 POLICY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION 8 9 An Act relating to waters and water rights; stating legislative findings; creating the Oklahoma Water Resources Board Well Driller and Pump Installer 10 Program; providing duties for certain program; providing requirements for certain training program; 11 stating duties of the Oklahoma Water Resources Board; requiring Board partner and provide funding to 12 certain institute of higher education; providing 1.3 certain criteria to be met; authorizing the promulgation of certain rules; creating the Oklahoma 14 Water Resources Board Well Driller and Pump Installer Program Revolving Fund; stating type of fund; stating 15 purpose of fund; authorizing expenditures; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and 16 providing an effective date. 17 18 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 20 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be 21 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows: 22 The Legislature finds that Oklahoma's groundwater resources face 23 critical threats from depletion and contamination due to unqualified 24 workers and improper water access practices. There is a nationwide

- geoscience workforce shortage projected by the United States 1 Department of Labor to peak at 130,000 workers by 2029, leaving Oklahoma's groundwater industry struggling to fill positions with 3 adequately trained professionals. The growing reliance on untrained 5 workers in the groundwater industry jeopardizes the safety of homes, businesses, and communities and accelerates the degradation of these 6 7 essential water resources. Immediate action is needed to protect these vital water resources and to equip the groundwater workforce 8 with the skills necessary to ensure sustainable water management 10 practices.
  - SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1020.16a of Title 82, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
    - A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Water Resources Board Well Driller and Pump Installer Program. The Program shall be administered by the Board and shall have the following duties:
    - 1. License well drilling and pump installation professionals to ensure the integrity of well construction, and that those professionals are meeting construction standards to prevent pollution of groundwater in Oklahoma;
    - 2. Develop comprehensive standards and rules in cooperation with the Well Driller and Pump Installer Advisory Council, the Oklahoma Ground Water Association, and public stakeholders;

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- 3. Provide for training and outreach for licensed well drillers
  and pump installers;
  - 4. Provide technical assistance to the public regarding groundwater and well construction; and
  - 5. Focus on funding and supporting the development and expansion of a groundwater professional training program at an accredited Tier 1 research institution of higher education in Oklahoma.
    - B. The groundwater professional training program shall:
  - 1. Support and expand an existing groundwater professional training program established by the National Ground Water Association;
  - 2. Provide specialized education and skills-based micro-credentials for both current and future groundwater professionals, including water well drillers, pump installers, plumbers, and heavy equipment operators; and
  - 3. Partner with state and national industry leaders to ensure workforce training is conducted using cutting-edge, industry-approved methods.
    - C. The Board shall:
- 21 1. Identify and establish a formal partnership with a 22 qualifying institution of higher education in Oklahoma;

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- 2. Provide funding for the program from the Oklahoma Water Resources Board Well Driller and Pump Installer Program Revolving Fund established in Section 3 of this act;
- 3. Provide technical assistance and other support to the institution to enhance the training program;
- 4. Work with industry stakeholders to ensure alignment of the program with current and future workforce demands;
- 5. Oversee the implementation, evaluation, and continuous improvement of the Program; and
- 6. Report annually to the Governor and the Legislature on the Program's progress and outcomes.
- D. To implement the Program, the Board shall partner with and provide funding for the Program to an accredited institution of higher education in this state that is:
- 1. A Tier 1 research institution of higher education in Oklahoma to ensure access to specialized subject matter experts in groundwater, as well as access to advanced research facilities and modern approaches to solving real-world problems in groundwater aquifer access. The institution shall have active community engagement and outreach to ensure both school-aged children and public populations are made aware of the critical occupations needed;

- 2. An institution that has an existing memoranda of understanding with state groundwater industry partners to ensure programming is created with industry-approved skills and outcomes;
- 3. An institution that has existing, or in-planning, opportunities for both university students and nonstudent populations to earn micro-credentials to showcase their achievement of industry-aligned skills;
- 4. An institution with a demonstrated history of developing groundwater workforce professionals, and the expertise necessary to produce high-quality training in groundwater and water quality subject areas;
- 5. Capable of providing training that has been created by individuals specializing in best practices in both online and inperson education for working professionals and have assessments for both program effectiveness and participant satisfaction; and
- 6. Capable of providing training that is flexible to meet the needs of the current and future workforce.
- E. The Board is authorized to promulgate rules to effectuate the provisions of this section.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1020.16b of Title 82, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund for the Oklahoma Water Resources Board to be designated the

1	"Oklahoma Water Resources Board Well Driller and Pump Installer
2	Program Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not
3	subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies
4	deposited to the credit of the fund by law. All monies accruing to
5	the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted
6	and expended by the Oklahoma Water Resources Board for the purpose
7	of administering the Oklahoma Water Resources Board Well Driller and
8	Pump Installer Program established in Section 2 of this act.
9	Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the
10	State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the
11	Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for
12	approval and payment.
13	SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
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
