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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5029.2 of Title 63, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. The state Medicaid program shall cover chiropractic care performed by licensed chiropractic physicians when such services are medically necessary for the diagnosis and treatment of illness or injury or to improve the functioning of a malformed body member.
- B. The state Medicaid program shall not exclude members from coverage under this section on the basis of age.
- C. No prior authorization shall be required for a member to receive medically necessary chiropractic care.

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1 The Oklahoma Health Care Authority Board shall promulgate 2 rules as necessary to implement the provisions of this section. 3 Ε. The Oklahoma Health Care Authority shall seek any federal 4 approval necessary to implement the provisions of this section. 5 SECTION 2.
