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ammunition from law-abiding citizens of this state shall be considered an infringement on the rights of citizens to keep and bear arms as guaranteed by the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States and Article II, Section 26 of the Oklahoma Constitution.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2202 of Title 25, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

It shall be the duty of the courts and law enforcement agencies of this state to protect the rights of law-abiding citizens to keep and bear arms within the borders of this state and to protect such rights from the infringement provided under the provisions of Section 1 of this act.

- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2203 of Title 25, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. No law enforcement officer shall obey or enforce any direct or indirect order which violates the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; Article II, Section 26 of the Oklahoma Constitution; or the law enforcement oath of the law enforcement officer.
- B. Any agency or department of this state, county, or municipality shall be prohibited from terminating or retaliating against any law enforcement officer who refuses to obey or enforce

any order which violates the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; Article II, Section 26 of the Oklahoma

Constitution; or the law enforcement oath of the law enforcement officer.

- C. The State of Oklahoma and any county or municipal government shall not cut any funding or budget from a county sheriff's office or municipal police department for:
- 1. Refusing to obey or enforce any order which violates the Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; Article II, Section 26 of the Oklahoma Constitution; or the law enforcement oath of a law enforcement officer; or
- 2. Making any county or municipality a Second Amendment sanctuary county or municipality.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2204 of Title 25, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

For the purposes of Sections 1 and 2 of this act, the term "law-abiding citizen" shall mean a person who is not otherwise precluded under federal or state law from possessing a firearm and shall not be construed to include anyone who is not legally present in the United States or this state.

SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
