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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1239 of Title 69, unless there
17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A. As used in this section, "critical emergency route" means a
19	road that is regularly traveled by first responders and other
20	emergency services personnel in the course of their duties.
21	B. 1. All roads in this state that have been designated by the
22	Transportation Commission as part of the state highway system or by
23	the Federal Highway Administration as part of the National Highway
24	System shall be designated as critical emergency routes.

2. Any political subdivision of this state may, by ordinance,
designate a road maintained by the county or municipality as a
critical emergency route if that road meets the definition of a
critical emergency route as provided in subsection A of this
section.

6 C. Any person who shall willfully or knowingly obstruct or 7 damage a road designated as a critical emergency route shall, upon 8 conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to 9 exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).

D. 1. Railroads or other persons, firms, or corporations operating over tracks within this state shall not block vehicle traffic at a railroad intersection with a road designated as a critical emergency route for any amount of time.

14 2. If a train is stopped for an emergency condition including 15 an accident, derailment, critical mechanical failure, track or 16 bridge washout, storm, flood, or other emergency situation, and 17 blocks vehicle traffic at a railroad intersection with a road 18 designated as a critical emergency route, the railroad or other 19 person, firm, or corporation operating the train shall immediately 20 notify the Department of Public Safety of the emergency condition 21 and identify the intersection or intersections affected. The 22 Department of Public Safety shall then notify the county sheriff or 23 municipal police department in whose jurisdiction the affected 24 intersection is located.

1	3. The Department of Public Safety shall have the authority to
2	issue a citation to any person, firm, or corporation that violates
3	the provisions of this subsection. Such person, firm, or
4	corporation shall be subject to a fine not to exceed One Thousand
5	Dollars (\$1,000.00) for each violation.
6	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2025.
7	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
8	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
9	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
10	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
