7	An Act relating to in vitro fertilization; providing legal protections for health care providers;

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 560 of Title 10, unless there is
17	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A. The technique of in vitro fertilization or human embryo
19	transfer may be performed in this state by persons duly authorized
20	to practice medicine at the request and with the consent in writing
21	of the husband and wife desiring the utilization of such technique
22	for the purpose of conceiving a child or children.
23	B. No person shall perform the technique of in vitro
24	fertilization or human embryo transfer unless currently licensed to

practice medicine in this state, and then only at the request and with the written consent of the husband and wife desiring the utilization of such technique. Said consent shall be executed and acknowledged by both the husband and wife and the person who is to perform the technique.

C. Any child or children born as a result of in vitro
fertilization or human embryo transfer shall be considered, for all
legal intents and purposes, the same as a naturally conceived child
of the husband and wife that consent to and receive in vitro
fertilization or human embryo transfer.

D. Human embryos created during in vitro fertilization shall be considered at law the patient's property.

E. There shall be no limit to how many number of human embryos that can be created, frozen, or implanted in a single in vitro fertilization cycle.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2025.
