**Research Analysis**

HB 1755, as introduced, provides that, notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the label approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency or the label consistent with the most recent human health assessment or carcinogenicity classification will be sufficient to satisfy any requirements for health and safety warnings under Oklahoma law.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1755 provides that certain pesticide warning labels that meet US Environmental Protection Agency requirements are sufficient to satisfy any Oklahoma state law warning label requirements. This measure has no direct fiscal or revenue considerations for the state.
