Research Analysis

HB 2233, as introduced, changes the Board as used in the Massage Therapy Practice Act from the State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering to the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision under which regulations and licensing of this act now fall. The measure also removes language opting out physicians or other licensed health care provider from being required to be licensed or registered with the State Board of Cosmetology.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2233 amends the Massage Therapy Practice Act by transferring all duties and authority from the State Board of Cosmetology and Barbering to the Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision. The Oklahoma Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision is a non-appropriated state agency; therefore, the provisions of this measure are expected to be absorbed within the agency's existing resources. As a result, HB223 has no direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
