HB 2262, as introduced, provides that under the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of Dementia Special Care Disclosure Act, if a disclosure form disclosing the type of care is not provided to any of the parties listed in the measure, it could result in a consumer protection investigation and the facility being held liable for fraudulent advertising and sales practices. Additionally, the State Department of Health may cite the facility if two or more discrepancies in services are found from the care or services described in the disclosure or provided during an inspection.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 2262 specifies potential consequences for facilities advertising dementia care that do not provide the required disclosure form to all parties specified in the Alzheimer's Dementia and Other Forms of Dementia Special Care Disclosure Act. Additionally, the State Department of Health (OSDH) may issue a citation if two (2) or more discrepancies are found between the services described in the disclosure and those provided during an inspection.

Officials from OSDH confirmed the requirements of this measure are objective within existing budgetary resources, therefore having no direct fiscal impact on the state budget.
