**Bill Analysis**

SB 1113 provides a rebuttable presumption that full disclosure of information to the parties in juvenile proceedings is in the best interests of the child. The presumption shall only be rebutted with a preponderance of evidence. The measure directs the court to order the disclosure of all records that are necessary and relevant to the court's determination of the best interests of the child using a protective order. Parties in the proceedings shall be prohibited from disclosing the records to third parties. The measure outlines the records subject to such disclosure.
