## Bill Summary and Fiscal Analysis:

SB 57 prohibits the operator of a motor vehicle from holding or using a hand-held cellular telephone while driving. The measure establishes a \$5.00 fine and a maximum court cost fee of \$95.00 for violators. The measure apportions \$33.72 of the collected fee to cover docketing of the case, filing of all papers, issuance of process, warrants, order, and other services to the date of judgment. Additionally, the measure apportions \$8.80 of the collected fee to the District Attorneys Council Revolving Fund, \$11.00 to the Oklahoma Court Information System Revolving Fund, \$4.50 to the Sheriff's Service Fee Account of the county, A.F.I.S. Fund, and the CLEET Fund respectively, \$1.30 to the Attorney General Victim Services Unit and the Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Account respectively, \$2.25 to the Sheriff's Service Fee Account of the sheriff of the county, \$4.28 to the Forensic Science Improvement Revolving Fund, \$0.12 to be retained by the county clerk, and \$9.00 to the Department of Public Safety Patrol Vehicle Revolving Fund. The measure authorizes the clerk to assess administrative fines. The measure prohibits law enforcement from confiscating a phone or extracting data to enforce compliance or retain evidence for a trial as it relates to this measure. Based upon the proposed fee schedule, the Administrative Office of the Courts anticipates a decrease in collections of \$15,534 for the District Courts and a decrease in collections for the Supreme Court of \$4,940.
