Identification cards that show the qualifications of each 4 member of the train crew aboard the train. 5 The Department of Public Safety may issue a citation to any 6 person, firm, or corporation that violates the provisions of this 7 section. Such person, firm, or corporation shall be subject to a 8 fine of: 9 1. Not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) but not 10 more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for a first offense; 11 2. More than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) but not to exceed 12 Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) for a second offense committed 13 within three (3) years; or 14 3. More than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) but not to 15 exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) for a third or subsequent 16 offense committed within three (3) years. 17 SECTION 2.
